

FREE 2 HELD IN GIRL'S FALL.

Roxbury Court Rules Any Charges Must Come From Miss Sutorious.

BOSTON, Oct. 18.—The Roxbury District Court today refused to issue a warrant in the case of Miss Ethel Sutorious of New York, a music student, who was found unconscious in an alley in the rear of her lodgings on Newbury Street, in the Back Bay, yesterday morning. The Court took the view that the young woman, having recovered consciousness, could prefer charges herself if she wished and ordered the discharge of two men, David Lythgoe, her tutor, and Raymond Racaldo. They had been detained overnight on suspicion.

From her hospital cot, where she was visited by Police Inspectors and her father, Ford Sutorious, today, she said that when she heard voices quarreling on the stairs approaching her room she fled to the window, sat on the sill and prayed for protection. She could remember nothing afterward, she said.
